Holybourne Hospital

Holybourne Hospital is an Adult Mental Health hospital for people of all genders with severe and complex mental health conditions based in London.

We provide high quality intensive treatment in a clinically safe, caring and secure environment supporting the NHS when intensive care needs cannot be met locally.

We support people over the age of 18 from across the UK who are detained under the Mental Health Act 1983 (2007).

Conditions we support

- Unexplained psychotic episodes
- Drug induced psychoses
- Severe depression
- Challenging behaviours as a result of mood disorders
- A relapse of Axis 1 type disorder such as mania or schizophrenia
- Personality disorder or mild borderline intellectual disability combined with other Axis 1 type diagnosis
- Acute episodes requiring intensive care
- Risky behaviours such as absconding, self-harm, suicide attempts, arson, violence and aggression and sexually inappropriate behaviour

We can also admit patients who require detoxification from alcohol or drugs or patients who are under a Community Treatment Order (CTO) which has been revoked.

Holybourne Hospital has four wards: two female acute wards and two male acute wards.





At a glance Service overview & facilities

We have four acute wards for people who are either detained or there voluntarily.

Our acute wards are for those who either need to 'step down' from a PICU setting or who have complex, severe or prolonged mental health needs but do not require the intensity of a PICU. We welcome patients to Holybourne Hospital from other PICU services as well as part of the discharge pathway from our own PICU services within the Group.

We are rated 'Good' with the Care Quality Commission (CQC) and can accept admissions 24-hours a day, seven days a week with treatment starting on the day of admission.
